A fifty-year-old male presented in our hospital for fever and swollen bilateral hand, especially left painful hand which had been consistent since yesterday. His hand was becoming numbness and turning color blue. His blood pressure revealed 80 mmHg. Present illness revealed body temperature 40°C, pulse rate 120/min, and SpO2 94 %. His left digit was swollen with cyanosis (Fig. 1). He was previously treated for ulcerative colitis.
